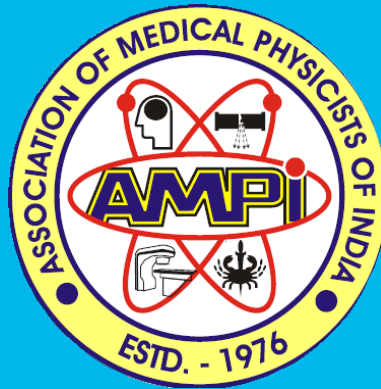

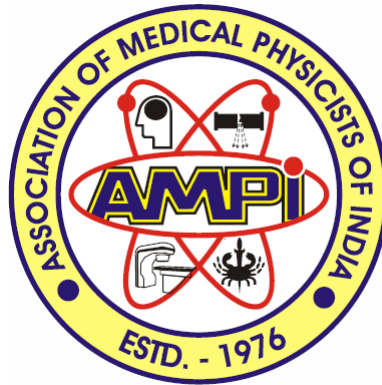

An Overview of Association of Medical Physicists of India

The Association of Medical Physicists of India (AMPI) was established in 1976 as a non-profit public trust organization with the objectives (i) to promote the advancements of physics as applied to medicine especially radiotherapy, nuclear medicine, radiology and biological sciences (ii) to take appropriate steps to carryout, support and to encourage research and development as well as teaching with various fields associated with application of physics in medical sciences (iii) to provide the forum for persons who are engaged or interested in the field of Medical Physics and to arrange scientific meetings and discussion.(iv) to initiate measures to disseminate worldwide information (v) to promote academic status of medical physics and its educational regulations in the medical institution where Medical Physics work is carried out in India and to encourage appropriate authorities to implement the suggestions laid down by the Association (vii) to initiate action and maintain the standards in the practice of medical physics by certifying members of AMPI by conducting periodical examinations.

The AMPI is affiliated to the Indian National Science Academy (INSA) as well to the International Organization of Medical Physicists (IOMP) and its constituent member of IOMP regional chapter, the Asia-Oceania Federation of Organizations for Medical Physics (AFOMP). The members' comprising of radiation/medical physicists, radiation oncologists, radiologists, biomedical engineers and technologists. The wide spectrum of membership reflects the multi- disciplinary nature of the medical physics profession and the association.

AMPI is periodically organizing the scientific activities in the form of annual conferences/workshop/symposia for improving professionals' standards for practicing Medical Physicists across the country since its inception 45 years ago. It is important to mention that AMPI "Medical Physics Bulletin" was started in 1976 up to 1996, and thereafter it publishes indexed scientific journal namely "Journal of Medical Physics" (JMP) in every quarterly and it has been accepted as a national leading journal and it has its reputation globally.

AMPI also established its academic wing namely College of Medical Physicists of India (CMPI) in the year 2009, to improve the academic standards and also to maintain the standard of professional practices of the Medical Physicists by conducting competency examination for accreditation and certification similar to the Medical Physics colleges of Canada, Europe, USA and Australia.

The General Body of the association is a supreme authority to control all activities and delegates its power conferred by its constitution to carry out the association affairs of professional, scientific, academic, administrative and financial aspects to achieve the objectives. AMPI is managed by the Executive Committee (EC), the Board of Trustees (BOT), editorial board of Journal (JMP) and the board of College (CMPI). ANNUAL REPORTS FOR THE YEAR 2022

I. Membership

Total 72 new members have enrolled during period Dec 08, 2021 to October 05, 2022 and their data have been uploaded on AMPI website. As on 05th October 2022 there are 2818 life members on the role of association. The details of new members list is enclosed in Annexure I.

II. General Body

The 45th Annual General Body meeting (AGBM) which was held from New Delhi through online mode on 26th March, 2022 at 3:00PM and the detailed minutes of 45th Annual GBM is enclosed for member's confirmation in Annexure-II.

III. Executive Committee Administration:

The administration of association is managed by executive committee (EC) and Board of Trustees. The administration related to professional development activities, scientific activities, academic/educational activities and financial activities of the association were carried out and reports of the same is presented for the period of 2022.

Highlights of the Executive committee meeting's important decisions/actions taken

Since the last Annual GBM held on 26th March 2022 through online, the executive committee (EC) met two times (301st and 302nd EC meetings), one in-person meeting and second one via online to transact the business of the association. The important decisions/action were taken as follows;

301st AMPI-EC meeting was held on 20th May 2022 at AMPICON2021 Bangalore

Action taken report:

(a) Regarding legal committee, the proposed 3 members out of 6 have not confirmed their consent, therefore the legal need to be discussed.

(a) NMC has not responded on our representation of Radiological Physics inclusion in the TEQ Regulation 2022.

(b) Mr.Akshay, Lawyer from Mumbai advised that no RTI should be sent to NMC for asking the reason. The RTI should be sent post representation after 15 days, if there is no response from NMC.

Matter of NMC and NCAHP pertaining to Medical Physics Profession and further course of action

The Secretary, AMPI shared the AMPI representation finalized by Lawyer and he requested all members to give their opinion, suggestions, input or any modification.

Through video call with lawyer from Mumbai during the EC meeting, all queries raised by members present were sorted out. After the detailed discussion, EC has unanimously approved the letter and decided to send to NMC authority once again to consider our matter on TEQ Regulation 2022 pertaining to the Radiological Physics speciality.

The Secretary, AMPI, informed to EC that he had meeting with Dr.Neha Garg, Secretary, Interim National Commission for Allied Health Professions Council (NCAHP) and submitted the AMPI representation to her office and requested for the Amendments in the NCAHP Act and also in the NCAHP council with regard to the categorization of our profession. It was decided to follow the matter with Commission.

2. Northern Chapter of AMPI representation proposal to AMPI main body.

The Secretary, AMPI informed to EC that AMPI office has received draft on AMPI Representation to NMC and NCAHP from Northern Chapter of AMPI. After going through the same, it was decided to follow the legal advice including the content of the AMPI representation. In order to get the chapter's view on important policy matter of AMPI, the future meeting can have the Chapters also in the online meeting.

3. Streamlining surplus money of AMPI conferences left over with Organizers after 5 years from the conference.

The Treasurer, AMPI informed to the EC that we are facing the issues in filing Income-Tax as the surplus money of AMPI conferences left over with organizers even after 5 years from the conference. For example AMPICON2015 by Kerala Chapter of AMPI and AMPICON2016 of AP&TS Chapter. After detailed discussion, it has been decided that the surplus money should be utilized by the host institution or by the chapter within the stipulated time; otherwise chapter should take action to send the Total Amount to AMPI Trust account so that income tax related issue can be taken care. The AMPI office should take action on this matter.

4. Regulation of Medical Physics Courses (uniformity of syllabus, number of students intake, periodic inspections from regulatory body, internship programs etc) Recommendation / Role of AMPI.

The Secretary, AMPI informed to EC that AMPI office has received from the EC member to take professional policy decision on regulating the Medical Physics Courses in India. After the detailed discussion, it has been decided that AMPI should send the representation to AERB on points such as (i) uniformity of the syllabus, (ii) number of students intake (iii) AERB periodic inspections to the educational institutions and (iv) internship program.

The current internship program should also include the training in the field of both Radiology and Nuclear Medicine for a minimum 6 months, in order to get the exposure and experience in all aspects of Medical Physics. It has been decided that the AMPI should request to AERB to change the nomenclature of current Internship program to Residency program similar to other medical post-graduates students.

It has also been decided that the AMPI office should send a letter to the Chairman, AERB to include the Medical Physicist authorized by AERB in the staffing requirements for establishing the Nuclear Medicine and Radiology speciality as there

was a technological advancement and complexity to ensure the safety and quality clinical practice.

5. Unique website for AMPI conferences

Regarding unique Website for AMPI Conference, It has been decided that as the conference module already exists, only home page is to be modified by the conference organizers.

6. An Update on AMPI Task Group on “Roles and Responsibilities of Medical Physicists in India”

Regarding the Roles and Responsibilities of Medical Physicists in India, It has been decided that under Medical Imaging Physics, there should be two categorization as X-ray Imaging Physics and Isotopes-based Imaging physics. The final draft of Task group will be prepared and finalized before November, 2022, AMPICON2022.

7. Any other matters with permission of the chair.

(a) It has been discussed and decided that due to increasing workload in the AMPI activities, the Joint Secretary of AMPI, Mr.Suresh Chaudhari to share the workload of Secretary, AMPI. The work of AMPI membership directory update to be looked after by Joint Secretary and Treasurer of AMPI.

(b) The Secretary, AMPI informed that there are number of AMPI general members' applications received from foreign health regulatory agencies such as HCPC, UK, Arab Health Authorities to endorse their application by national professional body towards their registration/license to practice. After discussion in detail, it has been decided that AMPI can charge Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five Thousand) as endorsement fee from such applicants.

(c) It has been decided that the Scoring module should be created for rating the applications of AMPI awards such as Dr.M.S.Aggarwal Young Investigator award, Best Oral and Poster Presentation Awards, and Meritorious Medical Physicist Award. Dr.Challapalli Srinivas, Dr.Pratik Kumar and Dr. Vijayaprabhu were nominated to coordinate with Mr. Srikant, AMPI website manager in this matter and make the system ready as early as possible.

(d) Dr.Challapalli Srinivas has requested EC to have next AMPI EC meeting at his place in Mangalore. But, due to uncertain pandemic situation, no decision was taken in this matter

302st AMPI-EC meeting was held on 27th August 2022 at 4 PM through online Action Taken Report

(A) PMO response on AMPI grievance letter regarding NMC TEQ Regulation 2022 and further course of action:

The Secretary, AMPI informed to the EC that on 10/08/2022, AMPI office has received response from PMO grievance portal (CPGRAMS) upon AMPI grievance representation

regarding the inclusion of the Radiological/Medical Physics Speciality in the NMC-TEQ Regulations 2022. Further the Secretary, AMPI read out the response/remark, as:

“Dear Sir, This issue of Radiological/medical Physics which has been left in the TEQ regulation 2022 is under active consideration and will be sorted out shortly at time of amendments in the regulation. Please feel free to write back to us in case on any issue. Thanks & Regards Aujender Singh, Deputy Secretary, PGMEB Mail:Aujender.singh@nic.in”

The committee has deliberated this issue in detail and decided further course of action that the AMPI committee for NMC matter will expand with few more members such as Dr.Manoj Semwal as Convener, Dr.Pratik Kumar, Dr.Vinod Pandey, Dr.Vijayaprabhu and Dr.Henry Finlay in the previous committee (Excluding Dr.V.Subramani) and this committee will look after the NMC TEQ Regulation 2022 matters. The AMPI office will provide all necessary support for the same.

(B) Status of BOT Change Report Submission

The Convener, BOT informed to Secretary, AMPI through email that on 24th August 2022, the Convener, BOT has visited Charity Commissioner office as per appointment given by it in connection with change report submitted. As per that office, we have to submit individual affidavit of each outgoing members of EC & BOT. This affidavit is also to be notarized. The consolidated affidavit is not accepted by the commission. The Convener, BOT requested EC to get the affidavit from all outgoing EC members and send it to him before next appointment with Charity Commissioner that is on 26th September 2022. In this regard, President, AMPI agreed to arrange the required documents from the previous committee members for the same.

(C) AMPI letter to AERB Regarding Regulation of Medical Physics in India

As per the AMPI 301st EC meeting decision, the Secretary, AMPI office prepared the draft and shared with President, AMPI for the review regarding the regulation on medical physics education in India. However, considering the recent development and response of AERB on Medical Physics education, it has been decided that AMPI will send the representation to AERB on only three important points such as (i) Medical Physics Staffing requirement in Radiology and Nuclear Medicine Departments in medical institutions across the country (ii) AERB recommendation on Teachers Qualification for Radiological/Medical Physics teaching to PG Medical courses in Radiation Medicine disciplines such as Radiology, Radiation Oncology and Nuclear Medicine specialities in the TEQ Regulations 2022 (iii) Requirement of Independent Department of Radiological/Medical Physics in the Medical Colleges and Universities wherever PG Medical courses in Radiation Medicine is available and also it is becoming necessary to ensure radiation safety in medical institutions.

In this regard, EC has decided that Dr.Manoj Semwal will help in making representation on these points to AERB and AMPI office will provide all necessary support for the same in sending the letter to AERB at the earliest.

(D) Streamlining Surplus Money of AMPICON Conference After 5 years

The Treasurer, AMPI informed to EC that as per the decision in its 301st AMPI EC meeting, he has sent the communication to the AMPICON2015 organizer and AMPI Chapter Kerala

regarding non-return of surplus money lying with AMPICON2015 organizer even after 5 years completion of the conference. However, President, AMPI informed to the EC that he has got communication from AMPICON2015 organizers that they are in the process of auditing and in a week time they will submit audit report to AMPI for filing income tax. It has been decided by the committee that we will give last chance to AMPICON2015 organizer to send the audit report to AMPI as per their requested time, if not then we will take up this matter to the GBM for the necessary action.

Nomination of the AMPI Dr. Ramaiah Naidu Memorial Oration award 2022

The secretary, AMPI moved the proposal to EC regarding the nomination of the AMPI Dr. Ramaiah Naidu memorial oration award for the year 2022. After detailed discussion and deliberations, it has been decided that Dr.D.D.Deshpande has been unanimously nominated for the year 2022 AMPI Dr. Ramaiah Naidu memorial oration award. This will be communicated to Dr.D.D.Deshpande by AMPI office and will be requested for his presence to receive the award in the AMPICON2022 at AIIMS, New Delhi.

Proposal to institute few more AMPI awards

(A) Research Excellence Award to the AMPI members

The Secretary, AMPI informed to the EC that AMPI office received proposal to institute few more AMPI awards such as Research Excellence Award. In this regard, the committee has deliberated in details about the proposal and decided to institute the same award in the AMPI for the AMPI members who have outstanding performance in the field of Medical Physics Research. In this respect, the committee comprising of Dr.Vijayaprabhu, Dr.K.M.Ganesh, and Dr.Henry Finlay will formulate the criteria for this award so that after approval from EC and GBM, the same award will be established in the AMPI soon.

(B) AMPI Dr.P.S.Iyer Memorial Oration Award

After the detailed discussion by EC, it has also been decided that AMPI will institute second AMPI award in the memory of and tribute to Dr.P.S.Iyer's contribution to the Medical Physics development in India in the name of **AMPI Dr.P.S.Iyer Memorial Oration Award** for lifetime achievement of AMPI members. This award will be given during AMPICON on the second day of the conference. In this respect, the committee comprising of Dr.Shobha Jayaprakash, Dr.Challapalli Srinivas, Mr.Karthikeyan and Mr.Suresh Chaudhari will formulate the criteria for this award so that after approval from EC and GBM, the same award will be established in the AMPI soon.

(C) AMPI Funded AFOMP Award in the AMPI Members Name

The Secretary, AMPI informed to the EC that AMPI office received proposal from AFOMP President to fund by AMPI to institute the AFOMP award in the name of AMPI members as AMPI contribution to AFOMP. After detailed discussion and deliberations, it has been decided that as there is already recently instituted AFOMP award in the name of Dr.U.Madduvnath. Therefore, similar to this proposal, the AMPI office will communicate to

IOMP about the feasibility to institute similar IOMP award in the name of Dr.U.Madduvnath and to understand the funding provision for the same.

(D) AMPICON2022 Progress Report

The AMPICON2022 organizing Secretary Dr.V.Subramani informed to the EC that as of 25th August, 2022, 131 abstracts have been received and few more are attempted for the submission. Also the national organizing committee, national advisory committee, international advisory committee and national scientific committee have been formed and will be included in the electronic copy which will be uploaded in the AMPI and AMPICON2022 website as soon as possible. He has also informed to the EC that there is format for the complimentary registration for all EC, BOT and CMPI members for the free of cost registration to AMPICON2022 and requested to all to collect and submitted for the same. He also asked BOT Convener and Secretary, CMPI to send the requirements for conducting Board and General body meetings.

(E) AMPI Joint Secretary for sharing the AMPI work with Secretary

The Secretary, AMPI informed to committee that due to increasing AMPI workload, it is necessary to share the workload of AMPI with Secretary by Joint Secretary, AMPI Mr.Suresh Chaudhari. It has been decided that Joint secretary should share the work with the Secretary, AMPI and he will communicate to him for the same.

(F) National Commission for Allied Health Professions (NCAHP) Matters

Dr.A.K Rath has asked about the status of Medical Physics issue in the National Commission for Allied Health Professions (NCAHP). The President, AMPI responded that AMPI office is carefully following the outcome of the meeting and response on our issues. He also informed that on 24th August, the NCAHP interim commission committee meeting was held and decided that immediate attention will be focused on the Medical Physics Education curriculum. Also it has been decided that AMPI will send the representation again to NCAHP regarding our representation status.

Further Action Taken and Initiatives during the 2022

(1) International Medical Physics Week (IMPW) Celebration:

IMPW2022 five days scientific program was organized during IMPW from 9-13th May, 2022. (IV) Board of Trustee (BOT)

Report of Board of Trustee (BOT) Activities during year 2022:

During the financial year 2021-22, new committee of BOT took over the charge from previous committee. Due to pandemic situation, transfer of records took place in July-2021. Following activities were carried out by the new committee:

1. For re-registration of AMPI Trust with income tax authority, which is mandatory requirement, certificate of registration under sec. 12A & 80G is required. The same were not traceable, so applied for duplicate copies of the same after filing FIR. After getting the duplicate one, AMPI trust got re-registered.
2. All financial formalities for changing of signatories were completed.
3. All investment instruments of BOT and JMP were monitored, regularised and updated.
4. Change Report was submitted to Charity Commissioner's office. Further compliance is being done.
5. First meeting of new Board of Trustees (BOT) was conducted in online mode on 22nd August 2021.
6. AMPI EC has transferred life membership subscription of new members to AMPI Trust.
7. Coordination with CA Shri Ramesh Iyer at Mumbai was done with regard to auditing of accounts of BOT and JMP.
8. All investments of BOT in the banks were renewed and updated.
9. Further investments of BOT are under review.

V) Scientific Journal of the Association

Report of Journal of Medical Physics (JMP) activities for the year 2022.

"All the 4 issues of 2021 of Journal of Medical Physics (JMP) were published in time in spite of the continued Covid problem. During 2021, a total of 100 manuscripts were received and evaluated. Out of these, 40 manuscripts were accepted, 43 were rejected and 17 are still under processing. The published manuscripts included a Review Article, Original Articles; Editorial, and Scientific / Technical Notes, Letters to Editor, Book Reviews and Obituary. For the year 2022, two issues have already been published and the preparation for the 3rd issue is under progress. A new manuscript handling website developed and introduced by the Publisher has undergone a continuous upgradation based on the feedback from the Editors. The teething problems have been overcome and the site is becoming seamless. During the current year (till Sept, 2022), 89 manuscripts have been received and a decision on several of them has been arrived at whereas several others are under processing. The double blinded review process of the manuscript has been strictly followed and continued. Each manuscript was reviewed by a minimum of 2 referees and the peer reviewing was kept mandatory for all manuscripts whether invited or proffered.

The need to strengthen and upgrade the Editorial Board and to attract experts from different fields to undertake the refereeing for JMP so as to enhance the quality and the speed of the refereeing process is becoming stronger."

(VI) Scientific Conference/Workshop/Symposia of the Association

Report of AMPICON2021

The 42nd Annual National Conference of the Association of Medical Physicists of India AMPICON2021 in association with Healthcare Global Enterprises Ltd., and AMPI-K chapter, was successfully conducted between May 19th - 21st May 2022 at the NIMHANS convention center, Bengaluru, after two previous postponements of scheduled dates due to COVID-19 related restrictions. The theme of the conference was "Artificial Intelligence— An emerging trend in Medical Physics." Despite the uncertainties and postponements looming over the conduct of the conference, many delegates willingly participated in the conference in large numbers. Exciting awards were presented to the winners of the Best Oral Presentation, Best Posters, Student Quiz, and Treatment Planning Competition. We were fortunate to have unwavering support from all our sponsors.
