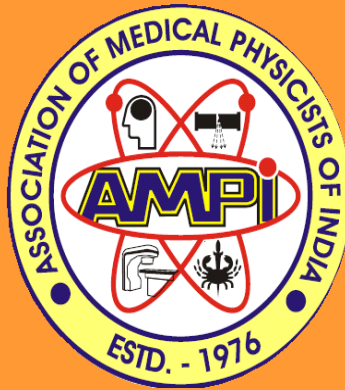

An Overview of the Association of Medical Physicists of India

The Association of Medical Physicists of India (AMPI) was established in 1976 as a non-profit public trust organization with the objectives (i) to promote the advancements of physics as applied to medicine especially to radiotherapy, nuclear medicine, radiology and biological sciences (ii) to take appropriate steps to carry out, support and to encourage research and development as well as teaching/training in various professional fields associated with application of physics in medical sciences (iii) to provide the forum for persons who are engaged or interested in the field of Medical Physics and to arrange scientific meetings and discussions. (iv) to initiate measures to disseminate worldwide information (v) to promote academic status of medical physics and its educational regulations in the medical institution where Medical Physics work is carried out in India and to encourage appropriate authorities to implement the suggestions laid down by the Association (vii) to initiate action and maintain the standards in the practice of medical physics by certifying members of AMPI by conducting periodical examinations.

The AMPI is affiliated to the International Organization of Medical Physicists (IOMP) and its constituent regional chapter, namely the Asia-Oceania Federation of Organizations for Medical Physics (AFOMP). The members comprise of radiation/medical physicists, radiation oncologists, radiologists, biomedical engineers and technologists. The wide spectrum of membership reflects the multi-disciplinary nature of the medical physics profession and the association.

AMPI, since its inception, periodically organizes scientific activities in the form of annual conferences/workshop/symposia for improving professional standards of practicing Medical Physicists across the country. It is important to mention that AMPI quarterly published a journal named "Medical Physics Bulletin" 1976 and up to 1996. Thereafter, it was converted into a full-fledged indexed scientific journal named "Journal of Medical Physics" (JMP). Over the years it has been established as a leading national journal with global reputation.

AMPI has also established its academic wing named College of Medical Physicists of India (CMPI) in the year 2009 to improve the academic standards and also to maintain the standard of professional practice of the Medical Physicists by conducting competency examination for accreditation and certification on the lines of best of such colleges in the world

The General Body of the association is a supreme body to control all its activities. The GB delegates its power to certain teams/committees conferred on it by AMPI's constitution to carry out the association's affairs of professional, scientific, academic, administrative and financial to achieve the objectives. The AMPI is managed by an Executive Committee (EC), a Board of Trustees (BOT), Editorial Board for JMP and the Board of the CMPI. ANNUAL REPORTS FOR THE YEAR 2023-2024

Membership

A total of 89 new members have enrolled during period from 30 Sep 2023 to 01 Oct 2024 and their details have been uploaded on AMPI website. As on 1st October 2024 there are 3014 life members on the role of the association. The details of the new members list are enclosed in Annexure I.

General Body

The 47th Annual General Body meeting (AGBM) which was held on 8th December 2023 at ICMP2023 venue at BARC, Mumbai and the detailed minutes of 47th Annual GBM are enclosed for members' confirmation. Annexure-II.

Executive Committee Administration:

The administration of association is managed by the executive committee (EC) and the Board of Trustees (BOT). The reports of the professional development activities, scientific activities, academic/educational activities and financial activities of the association are presented here for the period of 2023-2024.

Highlights of the Executive committee meeting's important decisions/actions taken

Since the last Annual GBM held on 08th December 2023 at AMPION2023 venue BARC, Mumbai, the EC met three times; once in-person and twice via online to transact the business of the association. The important decisions/actions taken were as follows:

AMPI EC MEETING – 13.04.2024

@ RGCI, New Delhi, Duration: - 4:30pm to 5:40pm

The First EC meeting of the newly elected AMPIEC/2024-27 was held on 13-April-2024, 4:30 PM at NCAMPICON venue, RGCI, New Delhi. There were total 12 members who attended the meeting, including the special invitees namely Dr. SD Sharma, the outgoing President, Dr S Sahoo, the outgoing Treasurer and Dr KJ Maria Das, Chairman, CMPI. Dr Manoj Semwal, President, AMPI chaired the EC Meeting and welcomed all the EC members and asked the Secretary to conduct the proceedings of the meeting with the listed agenda:

Agenda 1: Welcome all New EC Members of AMPI for the year 2024-2027 by President AMPI

The president welcomed all the EC members and the other invitees which included ex-President and ex treasurer of AMPI.

Agenda 2: To seek information about all the bank accounts being operated by AMPI.

Dr. S.D.Sharma, the outgoing president AMPI(2021-24) informed about the following bank accounts that AMPI holds:

One SBI account which is operated by the EC

One PNB account which is operated by the EC

One PNB account being maintained by the AMPI Trust (for Training Courses)

In addition, two bank accounts are maintained by the Trust (One Trust account and one JMP Account).

The New Treasurer, Dr Bhatt, enquired about the status of the AMPI account in PNB which is for training courses. To which Dr.Sharma replied that the details would be given to Office during the audit.

AMPI is providing financial support of the order of Rs 1.0 lakh for conducting AMPI workshop and Rs 1.5 lakh for conducting CMPI teaching courses.

During discussion about increasing the fee for training courses conducted at RP&AD Dr. SD Sharma wanted to keep the training fee the same. He informed that Rs.64000 per course is paid to BARC for infrastructure usage. (Note: this para has been rephrased as below)

During discussion, Dr Vinod Pandey suggested to increase the fee for training courses conducted at RP&AD, Dr. SD Sharma wanted to keep the training fee the same, as EC agreed with Dr. SD Sharma. Dr. SD Sharma informed that Rs.64000 per course is paid to BARC for infrastructure usage.

Agenda3: MCI matter related to Medical Physics Profession.

The President AMPI, Dr Manoj Semwal updated to EC about the progress of NMC matter. He informed that there was a plan of filing Writ Petitions on the NMC matter in the High Court of Delhi. As per the advice of the advocate the first WP will pray for direction from the honourable court for NMC to decide on the inclusion of Radiological/Medical Physics in the TEQ in a time bound manner. In case, the decision of NMC is not favourable to us, a second WP to be filed in the HC for a favourable decision. The fee for the each WP to be paid to the advocate is Rs 5.5 Lakh.

Dr. Ajai Srivastava's name was unanimously proposed as signatory on behalf of AMPI for the court proceedings. He graciously consented for the same.

Dr Sahoo informed that 10% TDS should be deducted from lawyer fees.

Dr Vinod Pandey suggested to decide the timeline for the AMPI action to file the case in the court preferably as early as possible and circulate the NMC final draft with all the relevant attachments to all the EC members to review and correction before filing the writ at the high court of Delhi. ---The Secretary informed that the draft will be shared to EC.

Agenda 4: Information about the authorities/ agencies/ person, where some important discussion and/or regular communication in progress.

It was decided to remove INSA affiliation from the AMPI letter head and other documents including the website.

Dr. V Subramani informed regarding the updates need to be done

Change report to charity commission is to be submitted

Resolution for Change signatories for Bank account

Website update is to be done.

Agenda 5: Completing the handing Over by Previous AMPI Office to Current AMPI office.

The outgoing secretary Dr Subramni handed over the records and documents to the new secretary DrAnuj Tyagi in a bag and in a pen-drive ((please mention the details of doc) and in the same way the outgoing treasurer Dr Sahoo handed over the documents to the new treasurer Dr. CP Bhatt.

Agenda 6: Discussion for sharing AMPI Office work among AMPI officers / Committees

Dr Vinod Pandey has suggested to form a AMPI committee for following up the matter of NCAHP Bill implementation. It was decided that a AMPI committee will be formed. A committee will be formed for the NCAHP matter pursual.

Agenda 7: Visionary Statement of all EC members

Dr. Vinod Pandey also informed the EC that AERB safety guidelines regarding increase in number of medical physicist in the high end linear accelerator (VMAT/IMRT/SRS/SRT etc) and other AERB related issues are still pending despite the representation given by AMPI since 2015. Therefore, AMPI delegation meeting with AERB on various issues including Medical Physics courses was decided . AMPIEC unanimously agreed to pursue the matter with AERB. -Dr.S.D. Sharma's name was suggested for co-ordinating with AERB to have a meeting of AMPI delegation as soon as possible. Dr.SD Sharma agreed for the same.

Agenda 8: Any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

Dr Maria Das Congratulated the new team.

Dr.CP Bhatt informed that one person from a teaching institution to be nominated by AMPI for CMPI EC. AMPI EC (president) will recommend the name soon.

Dr K M Ganesh submitted a letter for financial assistance to conduct a workshop at KMIO. He was informed to email the proposal to the AMPI office.

Minutes of the ZOOM online EC meeting held on 3th June 2024 at 8 PM

Date: 03.06.2024 Time: 8PM, Mode: ZOOM Meeting

Agenda-1: Welcome address by AMPI President

The president welcomed all the EC members.

Agenda-2: Discussion about the draft letter to AERB about Safety Code for Radiotherapy Practices and Radiotherapy Installations.

Dr.Srivastava proposed to enhance the number of requirement of Medical Physicists or manpower working in Radiotherapy department as was already in action by the group constituted by the BARC/AERB.

Dr.Subramani suggested that the requirements should be as per the Techniques used by the center like IMRT, IGRT and VAMT. Staffing in the line with IAEA safety guide and discussed staff level for private organizations - Faculty positions and clinical Medical Physicists.

Dr Raghvenra Holla proposed manpower requirement for IGRT wherein he proposed that there should at least two Medical Physicist and three technologists in the facility having IGRT.

Dr.K.M Ganesh suggested that there should not be a limit for number of applications in Brachytherapy. For Brachytherapy one Medical Physicist is mandatory in variable of Applications. All the EC members accepted the Minimum qualification and Internship (12 Months) as mentioned in the draft.

Point about the two years residency programme was not accepted by the EC as it is not feasible in India. Dr Vinod Pandey also suggested that there should be an examination for Medical Physicists too to improve the Medical Physics practice in the hospitals which was opposed by all members as the Universities were already running the well-designed qualification course. Members suggested for improving the Syllabus of Universities.

EC Suggested for reverting to naming the RSOs as earlier namely RSO levels 1,2 and 3 . Dr. K.M Ganesh suggested to remove the phrase “large volume centres” in the draft.

It was also explored that CMPI accredited Medical Physicists must get an enhanced perks or giving preference in the recruitment process. This proposal was not accepted by the EC as many of the members were not willing for this. as we are representing the Medical Physicist community in India and the same approved by the committee.

AMPI President suggested preparing a draft as per the EC decision before presenting to AERB meeting. AMPI President, Vice President and Secretary will be representing the meeting on 5th June on behalf of AMPI by suitable possible means of transport. Additionally, Dr Sudesh Deshpande will also join with the team as he is available in Mumbai.

After major deliberations on the various issues by Dr V Subramani, Dr CP Bhatt and Dr Varadrajan on the draft proposal to be discussed in the forthcoming AERB meeting.

Agenda 3: New Account opening

Dr C.P. Bhatt suggested for opening a new account with HDFC Bank to ensure the smooth functioning of our financial operations specifically for the Overseas transfer facility. Dr S.D.Sharma Ex President AMPI also inform to EC that we currently have two accounts ,one with SBI and another with PNB Bank ,both located in Mumbai. He further recommended that we could benefit from an additional account with private account to avail of better services and before starting the account need to ensure about the overseas transfer facility.

Agenda 3: Any other matter with the permission of the chair.

The meeting concluded with a consensus on the importance of the modification for the draft proposal and commitment to adhere to the proposed time line.

AMPI President thanked all EC members for their valuable contributions.

AMPI ONLINE EC MEETING – 21.07.2024, 11AM Duration: - 2 hrs

The EC meeting of AMPIEC/2024-27 was held on 21-July-2024, 11.00 AM in online mode on zoom. There was total 12 members who attended the meeting, including the special invited members as Dr. SD Sharma, Dr KJ Maria Das, President CMPI and Dr Madhu, Organising Secretary, AMPICON2024, Dr Dangwal, Chairman AMPINC.

Agenda 1: Welcome address by AMPI President

Dr Manoj Semwal, President, AMPI chaired the EC Meeting and welcomed all the EC members and asked the Secretary to conduct the proceedings of the meeting with the listed agenda.

Agenda 2: Notification about AMPI Annual awards during AMPICON2024. AMPICON Organizing Secretary will be the special invitee for the meeting to interact and discuss on award.

AMPI Secretary explained about the details of the Awards and the process of selecting the awardees.

AMPICON 2024 Organising Secretary addressed about the arrangements for the conference and details about the venue. He confirmed about the Registration and accommodation for the AMPI EC Members and BOT Members. He requested to help to talk with sponsors. Dr. Subramani explained about the way of fund raising to him.

Till now AMPICON invited 12 International faculties. Dr. Subramani advised him to get NOC from the concern authorities while calling the International Faculties. AMPI EC express their gratitude to Organising Secretary about the arrangements.

Agenda 3: Approval of the previous AMPI-EC minutes of meeting.

Agenda 4: Three-year visionary task of present AMPI-EC (Draft enclosed), Visionary Statement of all EC members

Dr. Sudhesh Deshpande submitted the document about the Three year visionary task. President explain the points in the document.

Dr. K.J. Mariadas given the idea about the enhance the roll of Medical Physicist in the field of NM & DR

Dr. CP Bhatt Presented about the Summer School and forming an AMPI Task Group. Dr.Mariadas suggested to focus on one or two topics initially.

Also Dr. Subramani and Dr. S.D. Sharma shared their experience about the process as they have experience in the area.

EC suggested that first Task Group about the Commissioning of LINAC and Dr. CP Bhatt will lead the group. After forming the group the first physical meeting of the TG can happen as per AMPI norms.

Dr.S.D.Sharma suggested that the Task Group report can be published in JMP.

Agenda 5: The committee formation to pursue the matter related to AERB, NMC, NCAMP etc
NMC – Dr Manoj Semwal. President, AMPI informed that the case listed for Monday (22.07.2024) hearing. As NMC matters are already taken care of by Dr Manoj Semwal, Dr Ajay Srivastava, Dr V Subramani and Dr Anuj Kumar. And AERB matters are taken care of by Dr Manoj Semwal, Dr V Subramani, Dr Anuj Kumar.

For Allied Health Council matter a group was formed with Dr. Vinod Dangwal and Dr Vinod Pandey. They could add a few more members to address the issue and inform the EC regarding the updates. EC suggested Dr. Radhakrishnan Nair, Dr. Pratik Kumar and Dr. Hota.

Agenda 6: Chairman BOT, Chairman, CMPI and Chairpersons or their representative from AMPI Chapters will be special invitees for suggestions on visionary suggestions on important issues.

Discussed with Agenda 4.

Agenda 7: AMPI Chapters are requested to submit the audited statement of their conference accounts or any other account during or before the meeting. For any further clarification please contact Dr C.P. Bhatt, Treasurer, AMPI.

Treasurer requested all the Chapters and CMPI to submit the audited report before end of this month and AMPI need to file the returns.

Agenda 8: New Account in Delhi, in HDFC to ease the process.

The new account will be started in HDFC Delhi without closing any existing account in Mumbai. The main purpose of this account is the International Money transfer. Dr. SD Sharma suggested that to confirm form HDFC about the International transfer process before opening the account. He addressed that previously managed by paying from individual and the AMPI settled the amount to the concern person.

Agenda 9: Any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

Dr.Vinod Pandey raised the concern about the financial support for the EC members to attend the AERB meeting in Mumbai. Process explained by the Secretary.

Dr. Gopi Shankar suggested that to have two Prizes for Best paper and Best poster. EC accepted the suggestion and the same will be discussed in the forthcoming GBM in Hyderabad. After GB approval it will be implemented.

Board of Trustee (BOT)

Report of Board of Trustee (BOT) Activities during year 2023-24

During the financial year 2023-24, following activities were carried out:

A physical meeting of BOT members was held on 8th December 2023 at the venue of ICMP-2023 at DAE Convention Centre, Mumbai and various issues were discussed. All investment instruments of BOT and JMP were monitored, regularised and updated. Coordination with CA Shri Ramesh Iyer at Mumbai was done with regard to auditing of accounts of BOT and JMP. It was noted that Chapters of AMPI are liable to AMPI according to Clause X of the constitution. Financial liabilities are defined in Clause X, 7 and 8. It is recommended that EC should discuss and clarify the liability of all its Chapters to them.

Scientific Journal of the Association

Report of Journal of Medical Physics (JMP) activities for the year 2023-24

The Journal of Medical Physics (JMP) is a quarterly publication of the Association of Medical Physicists of India. During the Financial Year 2023-24, four issues of the journal were published on scheduled time (June 2023, September 2023, December 2023 and March 2024). This year was a very successful year for the JMP as it has received the long-awaited Impact Factor (Clarivate Analytics). Now, JMP is a peer reviewed indexed journal comparable to many other journals available in the field of medical physics, radiation dosimetry and radiation safety. There is a significant increase in the number of articles submitted to the journal in 2023-24 because of the allotment of an impressive impact factor. Dr. Sunil Dutt Sharma, Associate Editor of JMP took over as Editor-in-Chief (EIC) of the journal with effect from 1st January 2024. Considering the increase in submissions of articles, the Editorial Board has been revamped and expanded with effect from January 2024. It is also notable that the number of articles published per issue has gone up to 20 as against about 10 articles per issue in the earlier years. The map of the articles published in the JMP indicates that it is a real global journal which attracts authors from almost all the continents. Finally, the Editorial Board places on record the outstanding contributions of Dr. A. S. Pradhan, Former EIC and the current Emeritus Editor of JMP.

Conference Report

International Conference on Medical Physics 2023 (ICMP-2023)

The International Conference on Medical Physics 2023 (ICMP-2023) was jointly organized by Association of Medical Physicists of India (AMPI), International Organization for Medical Physics (IOMP), Asia-Oceania Federation of Organizations of Medical Physics (AFOMP) and South-East Asia Federation of Organizations of Medical Physics (SEAFOMP) during 6 to 9 December 2023 at DAE Convention Centre, Anushaktinagar, Mumbai, India. ICMP-2023 was the 25th International Conference of IOMP (later corrected as 26th ICMP of IOMP). The theme of the conference was Innovations in Radiation Technology & Medical Physics for Better Healthcare. ICMP-2023 had brought together the experts, researchers, and professionals from around the world to discuss the latest advancements and breakthroughs in the field of medical physics and associated disciplines.

This conference was attended by about 1300 participants from 33 countries including 134 delegates/ invitees/ experts from outside India. More than 325 medical physics students and about 200 medical physics senior citizens also participated in this conference. ICMP-2023 brought together the medical physics professionals of four generations (4Gs). Thus, ICMP-2023 can be tagged as the conference 4Gs.

The opening ceremony of the conference presented the mixture of Indian tradition (lamp lighting, welcome to dignitaries by flower bouquets, felicitation of guests) and global scientific culture. Dr. Sudeep Gupta, a renowned medical oncologist who is currently the Director of Tata Memorial Centre (a premier cancer institution of India), was the chief guest for this function.

Dr. D. K. Aswal, Director, Health Safety and Environment Group, BARC; Dr. John Damilakis (Greece), President, IOMP; Dr Eva Bezak (Australia), President, AFOMP; Dr. Chai Hong Yeong (Malaysia), President, SEAFOMP; Dr. B. K. Sapra, Head, RPAD, BARC and Dr. S. D. Sharma, President, AMPI; Dr. V. Subramani, Secretary, AMPI were also on the dais during the inaugural function. The scientific committee was jointly chaired by Dr. S. D. Sharma, India (AMPI); Dr. M. Mahesh, USA (IOMP) and Dr. S. Fukuda, Japan (AFOMP). The programme of the conference was very comprehensive and it included almost all the topics of recent interests for deliberations such as artificial intelligence and medical physics, technology and techniques of radiation oncology, treatment planning, emerging and newer techniques of radiation therapy, imaging in radiation oncology, technology and techniques of medical imaging, emerging and newer techniques of medical imaging, radiation dosimetry and radiation safety, targeted therapy, radiation biology, modeling and simulation, translational research, education/training and certification in medical physics.

The scientific schedule included 4 plenary sessions (6 talks), 2 joint sessions (IOMP-IAEA and IOMP-IRPA, 4 talks), 6 IOMP schools (including 2 CMPI teaching sessions), 14 special symposiums (46 talks), 36 scientific sessions (36 invited talks plus 102 oral paper presentations), 2 technical sessions (11 technical talks from the exhibitors), 4 poster rapporteur sessions (15 reporters), 359 poster presentations and one evening lecture. Scintillating debates (2 sessions) on “Will AI replace clinical medical physicists?” and “Whether harmonization in certification of medical physicists are required?” and medical physics quiz competition (2 sessions) were the special attractions for many participants. Live telecast of the scientific deliberations was made through YouTube and links for all the deliberations are available at the conference website www.icmp2023.org. In addition, links of all the presentations have also been shared with IOMP, AMPI, AFOMP, and SEAFOMP for uploading at their websites.

The inclusion of YOGA session (special thanks to Prof Mahadevappa Mahesh for the proposal) in the mornings of 2nd, 3rd and 4th day of the conference was of special interests to many and it has been well appreciated. I am hopeful the Yoga session started from ICMP-2023 will be the part of many other conferences in the world.

In summary, the total deliberations of the conference included 233 oral presentations and 359 poster presentations. To cover such a large number of oral presentations, it was inevitable to conduct three parallel sessions (please see the scientific program available at www.icmp2023.org). It is worth mentioning here that IOMP introduced four cash prizes (two for best oral presentations and two for best poster presentations) to encourage and enhance the quality of presentations in addition to quality of scientific work. A panel of judges evaluated the proffered oral and poster presentations which was indeed a herculean task. A number of orations/awards were presented during the conference.

CMPI Report 2024

1: CMPI written examination 2024

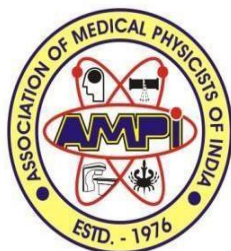

Agenda on (i) Progress Report of AMPICON2024 and AMPICON2025 bid

AMPICON2024 Progress Report:

Dr. Madusudhanan, Organizing Committee of AMPICON2024 has informed to the house that conference will be held at Banjara Bhavan, Banjara Hills, Hyderabad from 08-10 November 2024. The first announcement including details of registration fee for various category of participants was brought to the notice of the house and members present in the house were satisfied on the progress.

AMPICON2025 Bid

AMPI Office received the expression of interest for hosting AMPICON2025 in the given format from Dr. Lalit Mohan Aggarwal AMPI member from Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi through his employer and Dr. Jibon Sharma, AMPI member from Guwahati Medical Collage, Assam through Eastern chapter of AMPI. Both of the expression of interests was valid and these were thoroughly discussed

in the house. Finally, Dr. Lalit Mohan Aggarwal agreed to withdraw the proposal. The proposal of Dr. Jibon Sharma, GMC, Guwahati, Assam was approved by the house unanimously for organizing the AMPICON2025 at Guwahati, Assam.

To update on outcome of and the action plan on issues of NMC &NCAHP

The Secretary, AMPI informed to the house that AMPI subcommittee for NMC lead by Dr. Manoj Semwal is following with NMC Deputy Secretary, Mr. Aujender Singh regarding progress in the amendments of TEQ Regulation 2022 for including our profession in the Gazette notification. However, there is no progress till date. Also it has been informed that three members in the subcommittee Dr. A. K. Rath, Dr. Manoj Semwal and Dr. V. Subramani had discussed with Supreme Court legal counsel for the process and fee for filing WRIT petition in Delhi high Court.

After detailed discussion, it has been decided that we should pursue both administrative avenue by doing follow-up with NMC and also to expedite the legal process for filing a case against NMC for deliberately delaying the amendments and not including our speciality professionals in the TEQ regulation 2022.

Similarly, after our representation to the National Commission for Allied and Healthcare Professions (NCAHP) to make amendments in the serial No.8 of the schedule of the NCAHP, Act 2021, we have not got any positive response from NCAHP as of today. 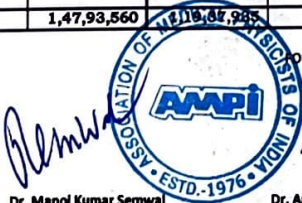
